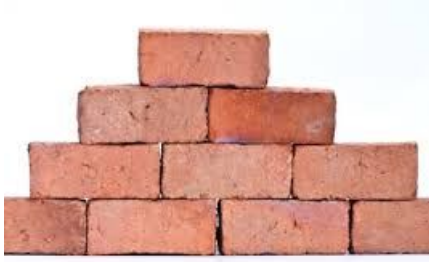


Brick Making



Many houses and structures in Colonial North America were made out of wood, but wood was a tricky material to build with because it is flammable. An alternative building material at the time was bricks. Bricks could be made from materials in the area by different types of workers.

Today, we are going to make our own miniature bricks and use them to build a structure.

Instructions

- Find the following material in your kit:
 - Model Magic Clay, Table covering
- Use the table covering or a cutting board on a table to keep your work surface clean
- Determine how many bricks you'd like to make and how large or small you'd like to make them.
- Separate the clay into sections and begin shaping them into bricks.
- Once you've completed making your bricks, allow them to sit for about 72 hours so they can dry
- Once the bricks are dry, you may use them to build a structure of your choosing.
