

Make your own Candle



Candle Making was another very important skill that women in colonial times needed to have. Without candles, you wouldn't have a light source on cloudy days or at night. While candle making in the colonial era would have taken a long time, we are going to complete a craft that takes less time, but still makes a candle we can use!

- Step 1: Find the following items in your camp kit:
 - Wax Honeycomb Sheet
 - Candle Wick
- Step 2: Take the wick, and place it at the edge of your honeycomb square. Make sure part of the wick is sticking out on one end!
- Step 3: Carefully roll the honeycomb square and the wick together. Continue to roll until your candle is all rolled up!
- Step 4: If your candle feels a little loose, you can squeeze it in your hand to tighten the wax around the wick. Keep in mind, it may squish the design a bit on the outside!
- Step 5: Mold the wax tightly around the wick, making sure part of the wick is still sticking out.
- Step 6: Mold the wax together on the bottom of your candle. When done, flatten the bottom of your candle out!
